All three control measures are mandatory (CM 4.a, CM 4.b and CM 4.c). CM 3 & 4.a: The Organization shall provide their procurement foresters and suppliers with educational information that includes the following required elements: • Information about why specified risk has been designated		
 A clear statement that materials from land where HCVs are threatened by forest management activities are considered to be unacceptable materials by the Organization A clear statement that when these areas are known by a supplier, the Organization expects the supplier to either 1) avoid sourcing from these areas; or 2) mitigate threats to the HCV(s) prior to sourcing from these areas Guidance and resources for avoiding sourcing from areas where an HCV(s) with specified risk designated is threatened by forest management activities, that was developed using best available information. The guidance and resources shall include, but are not limited to, identification of the HCV(s) and forest management recommendations for avoiding harm to the HCV(s). NOTE: It is the intention of FSC US to provide certificate holders with educational materials that may be used by the Organization to implement this control measure. The FSC US educational materials will be aligned with the contents of the Controlled Wood Regional Reports as described below, and will be updated as new Reports are released. If these FSC US-supplied materials are not available, the Organization shall develop their own. Compliance Verification: The Organization shall demonstrate when and where educational materials were provided and the contents of those materials. 	 The following statement: "Any conversion of forest to plantation or non-forest use may have negative impacts on social, economic and/or environmental values. However, the greatest risk of materials from conversions entering the supply chain is from larger conversions. Therefore, to minimize the risk of adverse impacts from conversion, and the risk of materials from conversions entering the FSC supply chain, we will not accept materials from converted forest areas that are greater than 100 acres (40.5 hectares)." Guidance for avoiding sourcing from areas of conversion, that was developed using best available information NOTE: It is the intention of FSC US to provide certificate holders with educational materials that may be used by the Organization to implement this control measure. CM 3 & 4.b: The Organization shall implement one of the two following options for FSC US Regions relevant to the Organization's supply area:		
CM 3 & 4.b.i: The Organization shall send a representative to attend FSC US-coordinated Controlled Wood Regional Meetings when they occur. The representative shall participate in all of the following elements of the regional meetings:
